



Sitcom star Ashton Kutcher has dished the dirt on Barbara and Jenna Bush

That '70s Show star tells of first twins' WILD PARTY NIGHT

# NIGHT THE BUSH GIRLS WENT UP IN SMOKE

BARBARA and Jenna Bush acted more like movie potheads Cheech and Chong than first daughters at a Hollywood bash a couple of years ago, says hunky actor Ashton Kutcher.

During a party at his house in 2001, the star of Fox's *That '70s Show* reveals he walked into a roommate's bedroom and found the twins sitting around a water pipe, engulfed in a cloud of marijuana smoke.

"The Bushes were underage, drinking at my house," Kutcher, 25, recalls. "I go upstairs to see another friend and I can smell (pot) wafting out under his door. I open the door and there he is - smoking out the Bush twins on his hookah."

The 21-year-old twins are well-known for hearty partying. Since October 2000, both have been caught using fake IDs to drink illegally. In May 2001, Barbara was busted for having a margarita at an Austin, Texas, restaurant and Jenna was cited for trying to pass off a friend's license as hers. They were fined and forced to perform community service.

That was a second offense for Jenna. And a year later, when she

was 20 years old and still underage, she was seen tossing back an assortment of cocktails in an Austin nightspot, even though a third bust would have meant a 180-day sentence in jail.

Now, it appears as though booze isn't the twins' only vice. And Kutcher, who suspects that his phone has been tapped by the Secret Service ever since the party at his house, isn't the only one speaking out.

"Not only do Barbara and Jenna Bush drink to have a good time, but I've smoked pot with both of them," former high school pal Matt Kuhles has claimed.

Meanwhile, the twins' concerned mom, first lady Laura Bush, has wanted her daughters to get counseling for their drinking problems. But their dad, President Bush, believes that a stern lecture and understanding is all the girls ever needed.

"Jenna and Barbara get a lot of heat because they're the president's daughters," a source close to the Bush family tells GLOBE.

"But, in fact, they're really not any

wilder than the average college kid.

"They're fun-loving, lively girls who enjoy getting out and socializing. And part of the college experience is drinking and smoking pot at parties. The only difference with Jenna and Barbara is that the spotlight is on them."

The source goes on to say that Barbara, who attends Yale, and Jenna, a student at the University of Texas, don't let their active social lives interfere with their schoolwork.

"There's no way they could drink and party constantly and still maintain their grades to remain in top-notch universities," explains the source.

Another source close to the White House adds, "The president and Mrs. Bush are pretty happy about how the girls have cleaned up their acts in the last 18 months, so they won't be in hot water over this."

"After 9/11 and the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq, the twins both pulled in their horns. If they party now, they do it sensibly. They're regular kids, though, not machines. And they keep telling people, 'Nobody's perfect.'"
