who was fired in October 2003 after three years on the program - was about to sue Barker and three other staffers. "The Price Is Right was the worst work atmosphere I've ever experienced," said Jordan, 32. She said Barker fired her because she had complained to producers about racial and sexual comments on set.

"You are the butt model, I can fire your ass,' one producer kept telling me. And I was also always told to stand between two Caucasian models to do a 'reverse Oreo,'" Jordan said. "Bob was absolutely the boss from hell."

Barker's publicist Henri Bollinger confirmed Jordan and Clement-Henry's lawsuits were settled, but added, "Bob was not directly involved, was not privy to any of the settlement discussions and did not pay any of the legal fees. He was named in the lawsuit, but was not part of the settlement."

Attorney Alden said: "Bob Barker

always plays smart-ass, saying his name is not on the settlement. But the settlement automatically releases him from further legal action, so he's a huge part of it."

Barker still faces wrongful termination suits filed by show model Holly Hallstrom and production assistant Linda Riegert. Hallstrom is waiting for a court date and Riegert is scheduled to go to arbitration next year.
