BRIDGET FONDA MAKES BEAUTIFUL MUSIC WITH TOP FILM COMPOSER

NEVER-MARRIED actress Bridget Fonda is finally taking the plunge.

The 39-year-old Single White Female star has just become engaged to Danny Elfman, one of Hollywood's top film composers.

"Bridget is totally in love with Danny and so excited he finally popped the question," a source close to Fonda tells GLOBE. "He gave her a three-carat diamond ring, which she proudly shows off to everyone she sees."

A longtime family friend says, "Bridget has finally met the man of her dreams. She's had a rocky romantic life and I'm glad she's settling down before she turns the big 4-0."

Bridget comes from an acting dynasty that includes father Peter Fonda, aunt Jane Fonda and her late grandfather Henry Fonda.

But her future hubby comes from a family successful in its own right. His nephew is actor Bodhi Elfman, who's married to Dharma & Greg star Jenna Elfman, and Danny's brother is actor-director Richard Elfman.

Danny, 49, is one of Hollywood's most sought-after film composers. He's provided the score for dozens of films, including Spider-Man, Terminator 3 and Men in Black. He's also composed the theme to TV's The Simpsons.

"Bridget has finally found a guy who's on the same high artistic level as she is," adds the family friend. "They truly make a perfect couple."

But before she began making beautiful music with the former Oingo Boingo rocker, Bridget was heartbroken after her relationship with actor Eric Stoltz, her live-in lover of eight years, ended in 1998. She had once said that the Mask star was "the love of my life." Then in 1999, Bridget briefly set up house with country crooner Dwight Yoakam in the Hollywood Hills.

Her spokesperson Nancy Seltzer confirms the engagement and

says, "Bridget is extremely happy."

But her happiness quickly turned to horror Feb. 27, when her Jaguar flipped over in a rain storm as she drove along the Pacific Coast Highway in Los Angeles. She was rushed to the UCLA Medical Center for treatment.

"It was a horrific accident and things could have been a lot worse," says a source. "Bridget was badly shaken up, but she's going to be fine."
