

SPIN CITY STAR'S DAUGHTER BUSTED FOR BURGLARY

CHARLIE SHEEN's 16-year-old love child was busted for burglary after embarking on a wild spree in a posh shopping center, cops say.

Cassandra Estevez, the Spin City star's daughter with his high school sweetheart, swiped merchandise with two friends, police charge, from two ocean-side shops in Malibu, Calif.

"The suspects were arrested for felony burglary," says an L.A. Sheriff's Department spokesman. "The lesser charge of shoplifting did not apply to them because they clearly entered the stores with intent to commit theft."

The girls allegedly threw the stolen goods in the trunk of Estevez's car and drove off, but a store owner copied down the license plate number, which was quickly traced to Estevez.

"Officers confronted the three girls," says a police source. "They confessed and showed some of the clothes they had stashed in the trunk."

The teens were arrested and their parents called down to the station. Estevez's mom is Paula Profitt, 34, who goes by her married name Strees. Sheen refused to marry her when she got pregnant, and his West Wing star dad Martin

Sheen helped support the girl.

"At first, Cassandra's mother said, 'Fine, arrest her, she needs to learn,'" says the police source. "But I think she just wanted to scare her daughter."

"Officers took them home, where Strees made her daughter gather up additional stolen goods from her bedroom and return it to the station, where the owners of the stores Stella Maris and Planet Blue were waiting."

Estevez was defiant, says a source.

There were bags filled with pants, tops & bras'

"At one point," the insider reveals, "she yelled, 'I don't know why I have to return these clothes!' One officer replied, 'Because they're not yours!' There were bags filled with pants, tops, underwear and bras. They had to go through them, admit who stole what and return them to the

store owners."

Strees, says an eyewitness, seemed to expect that her daughter would be freed after all the goods were returned. "But when the officers explained that the store owners were going to press charges, she turned on Carolyn Montgomery, owner of Stella Maris," reveals the source. "'How could you? Cassandra's grandmother spends a fortune in your store!' Strees yelled at her."
