and Eva Longoria
Parker – gang
up on Nicollette's
character, Edie.

"They march up to Edie's house and pound on her door, screaming at her to come out," said the insider.

"When they finally leave, Edie opens her door and yells, 'I made a mistake! Please forgive me!'

"Everyone's keeping a tight lid on exactly what happened to prompt the other housewives to rip into Edie, but it may mark the beginning of the end for her character."
