DREW WEDS WACKY BEAU IN SECRET SEASIDE CEREMONY

MORE than once, Drew Barrymore and Tom Green have teased fans by announcing they'd tied the knot. But they've done it for real — and it was there to witness the celebration. Drew was gushing with excitement, "an eyewitness confides. She smiled from ear to ear the evening and she looked so beautiful." The nuptials took place July 7 on a picturesque bluff in Malibu, Calif., overlooking the Pacific Ocean. While a simple ceremony, music and other hymns played in the background. "It was such a sweet, romantic wedding," says the eyewitness.

"Drew wore a stunning, full-length white gown, with lacy sleeves and a plunging V back. She had flowers in her hair and held gardenias in her hand. "There were four bridesmaids and a flower girl. Tom's best man was his brother, Joe. And Drew's mom Jaid walked her down the aisle. It was really nice to see that after all the problems the two have had in the past, they reconciled in time to share this beautiful moment in Drew's life." Barrymore, 26, and actor-comedian Green, 29, tried to keep the wedding a secret, even posting a banner on the rented property that read "Happy Anniversary George and

Eileen" to throw off spectators. But GLOBE managed to get a firsthand look at the spectacular bash. "Huge white tents were set up to accommodate the 150 guests," says the eyewitness. "But the party was low-key in the sense that there were few famous people. Mostly, it was just family and friends." Barrymore's celebrity guests included fellow Charlie's Angels Cameron Diaz and Lucy Liu, her Wedding Singer co-star Adam Sandler and grunge rocker Courtney Love, her good friend. On the menu was curried Indian food, accompanied by free-flowing

champagne and a traditional multitiered wedding cake for dessert. Afterward, a DJ spun out an odd mix of opera themes, country music and disco. "Everyone had a great time," says the source. "The whole affair was elegant, yet simple. Taking place outdoors, it had a very natural feel — though it must have cost at least \$250,000." Back in April, prankster Green told a newspaper, "Drew and I were recently married" and told talk-show host David Letterman on his show, "Married life is good."
