can her show biz career in and went on to do bit parts on 50 TV series, from I Love The Untouchables. Her first marriage, in 1953 to blueblood Frederic Gallatin Cammann, ended in 1956. Liz fell for hard-drinking actor Gig Young. "Their marital life became public in 1962 when Liz was filming Kid Galahad with Elvis Presley," declares Piro. "Liz dragged her to his dress-

ing room and screamed at her loud enough for the whole set to hear. Elvis had to intervene, and warned Gig never to speak that way to Elizabeth again - 'or else.'" Montgomery met her third husband, producer William Asher, when she starred in Johnny Cool. After they married, Asher created Bewitched, which first aired in 1964. During the show's smash eight-year run, Elizabeth gave birth to

their three children. Sadly, things went sour, and they quietly divorced in 1974. Liz met her fourth husband, actor Robert Foxworth, making the TV movie, Mrs. Sundance. In 1994, Liz was diagnosed with inoperable colon cancer.

Foxworth - whom she called "the love of my life" - and her children were at her side when she passed away at the untimely age of 62 in 1995.

Piro's book quotes Liz as saying, "If this big bubble should burst overnight, I won't be upset. I'll still have my family and with them, I needn't worry about anything."
