**G**AME-show host John O'Hurley is telling the truth when he crows about how much he loves his spectacular, hilltop Hollywood home.

The silver-haired hunk, who starred as Elaine's goofy boss J. Peterman on *Seinfeld* and now hosts *To Tell the Truth*, invited GLOBE along for an exclusive tour of his million-dollar-plus palace, which he bought in 1998 and offers a breathtaking view of Los Angeles.

"This house was built in 1942

and was one of the earliest homes constructed in the area," the dashing 47-year-old actor, who hosts the Mrs. World pageant this month, tells us. "It has a fantastic, unobstructed view of the San Fernando Valley."

The 2,500-square-foot home boasts a majestic pool-patio area and huge windows featuring panoramic views of the city below.

O'Hurley completely remodeled and decorated the three-bedroom, two-bath house to reflect his many interests, personally choosing the building materials and furniture.

He enlarged the master bedroom and turned the other two bedrooms

into an office and guestroom. "Everything here is all me," he says.

The overhanging deck contains the patio, swimming pool, barbecue and a

fire pit of Texas River rock, which is the focus of an entertainment center. A large screen pulls down for viewing TV or movies. Music is piped through outdoor speakers.

The star loves to cook and his spacious kitchen has a convenient center area for preparing dishes, which his guests wash down with fine wine from his collection. Large windows in the office allow a view of the greenery on the hillside.
