and her fortune. To solve that problem, Mary-Kate was admitted to Illuminata, a women-only facility in Georgia, for 48 hours.

"That gave her parents the vital time they needed," a source told The ENQUIRER.

"They got Mary-Kate into Illuminata while they decided where to send her long-term.

"She was brought in by her own people after flying into Atlanta, 55 miles away.

"The staff knew only that they were expecting a big-name celebrity.

LOOKED LIKE HELL

"They were stunned when it turned out to be Mary-Kate Olsen. They were told she was there for problems with powdered cocaine.

"She was calm and behaving nicely, but she looked like hell.

"She was very skinny and pale. Her eyes seemed sunken into her face."

The country hideaway was an unlikely destination for the high-flying twin.

Illuminata, a tiny facility with space for fewer than a dozen clients, is located in a wood frame house five miles outside the town of Cumming.

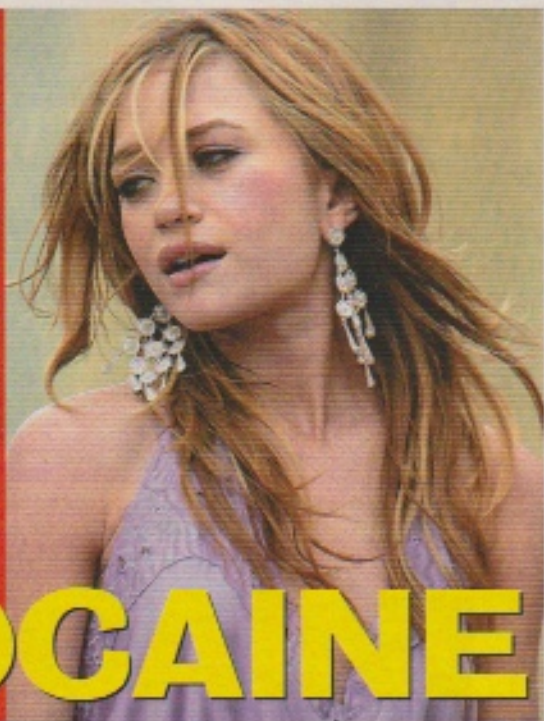
The house itself — unmarked by any sign — is set back among 21 acres of tall pine trees and is invisible from passing traffic.

Mary-Kate spent about 48 hours at Illuminata, then flew to Utah and checked into the Cirque Lodge in Orem.

The Cirque Lodge is a 26-bed

facility located in a warehouse-type building where the "Donny and Marie" show was taped during the 1970s.

"A typical stay at the center is 30 days and costs \$30,000," said a source.

DRUG ADDICTIONS

"It's known for treating alcohol and drug addictions. Most patients have problems with at least one, if not both, addictions."

On June 25, The ENQUIRER snapped exclusive photos of Mary-Kate at the facility after a 12:30 p.m. lunch break.

"Mary-Kate was wearing a red-and-dark-orange-colored cowboy hat to protect her skin from the blazing sun," an eyewitness told The ENQUIRER.

"She came out on a patio-like gazebo and sat down for a few minutes. She talked to a few fellow patients, then went back inside."

Another eyewitness who saw Mary-Kate told The ENQUIRER: "I barely recognized her. She was very skinny — too skinny.

"She was wearing sunglasses, a big floppy hat and a huge blue sweater over a shirt, baggy pants and sneakers.

"When she started talking, she made it obvious that the stuff about her having an eating disorder wasn't the real story at all.

"She actually laughed when she said, 'Everyone thinks I'm in here because of anorexia, but I don't care. So what if

people think I'm too thin.' Then she admitted cocaine was also her problem, said the eyewitness.

"She's determined to give up drugs. She told me, 'I never want to see cocaine again. I want to start my life over. And I want to finish with my boyfriend David.'"

Mary-Kate spent her 18th birthday at Cirque Lodge all alone. She had no visitors — not even her sister, Ashley.

The ENQUIRER consulted several medical experts, who are not currently treating Mary-Kate to learn more about how her eating disorder could impact her treatment for cocaine addiction.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE

Dr. Lawson Bernstein, a substance abuse expert and psychiatry professor at the University of Pittsburgh, said "Any addiction is a doorway into any other addiction. There is an addictive quality to eating disorders and a lot of the same brain-reward circuitry is involved."

"There is an issue of cross-addiction, which means you start out being addicted to one thing and end up addicted to another.

"Any time you have to treat two disorders rather than one, generally the presence of the two makes the patient exponentially worse.

"For patients like Mary-Kate with more than one clinical problem, it will be harder to be treated.

"She may end up being in an in-patient facility for quite some time."

"Poor Ashley. Not only is she dealing with Mary-Kate's problem, but she can't even turn to Matt for emotional support," a source close to Ashley told The ENQUIRER.

"All through high school she relied on him as a friend, as well as a boyfriend. They ended on good terms. But now that he's dating Lindsay, it's very awkward for her to go to him."

Ashley and Kaplan, 20, a Columbia University

"Ashley really loved Matt, and after three years together it was a really big step to break up with him," a pal told The ENQUIRER.

"I feel awful for Ashley. This was supposed to be a super summer for her and Mary-Kate — turning 18, and getting ready for their big move to New York.

"Instead, she's worried to death and feeling very alone. It's the first time she's been separated from Mary-Kate for more than a few days, and the first time in three years she's without a boyfriend."
