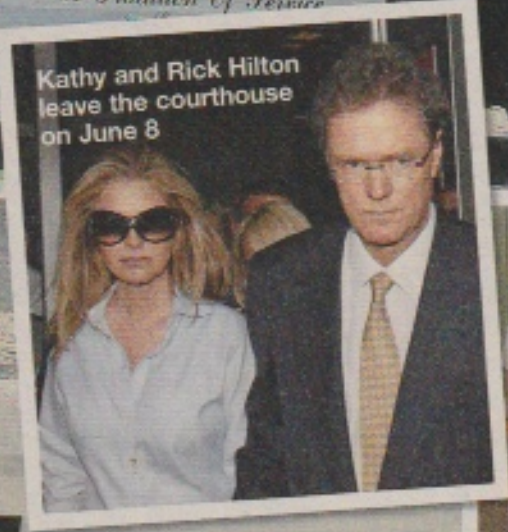

SUICIDE THREAT GOT PARIS OUT OF JAIL EARLY

THE real reason Paris Hilton was sprung from jail after serving just three days of her sentence is because she threatened to commit suicide! Before a judge sent her back to the slammer, the 26-year-old heiress was freed to go home with an electronic monitoring bracelet due to an undisclosed medical condition – and *The ENQUIRER* has learned the sensational details behind her early release.

“For Paris, jail was worse than anything she ever imagined,” a source close to the Hilton family told *The ENQUIRER*.

“She thought she was mentally prepared to handle it, but after two days, she fell apart.

“She was having severe panic attacks and breaking out in night sweats. She couldn’t sleep because she didn’t have her sleeping pills.

“All she did was pace up and down her cell, sobbing uncontrollably.”

Concerned, her mother Kathy sent Paris’ therapist to the jail, the source said.

“The therapist reported back to Kathy that Paris was suicidal. Kathy set about doing whatever she could to get her daughter out of jail,” said the source.

“Kathy arranged for the therapist to send a report to jail officials. He was able to convince them that Paris was mentally unstable and needed to be treated at home by her private doctors.

“**IN VIEW OF PARIS’ FAME**, authorities felt it was too much of a liability to keep a disturbed inmate who was threatening to kill herself. And they didn’t want their medical staff to be responsible for her treatment.”

Paris was released – but a day later,

she was ordered to appear in court. On June 8, she was driven in a police squad car – in handcuffs – to Los Angeles County Superior court where Judge Michael T. Sauer ordered her back to jail.

SHE WAS INCARCERATED

in the maximum security medical ward of Los Angeles’ Twin Towers detention center and ordered to serve all of her original 45-day sentence.

Paris announced in a press release that she would not appeal the judge’s decision. But family members believe she’s

bipolar, and they’re desperately trying to get her transferred to a rehab facility.

“The family and a team of lawyers are hoping the judge who ordered her back to jail will agree to have Paris treated for alcohol and drug abuse instead of putting her in the county jail,” said another insider.

“The judge had asked to see her medical records, but the sheriff – who released her early – didn’t produce the paperwork in time, so he sent her back to jail.

“Now everyone is scrambling the paperwork in order to press the judge.

“For now Paris is in the Twin Towers Correctional Facility where she can freely talk to other inmates. She’s not home, but it’s not a dirty, crowded cell either.”
