# SHIRLEY JONES SLAMS ANTI-WAR CELEBS



SHIRLEY JONES, the peace-loving hippie mom on *The Partridge Family*, has broken ranks with anti-war celebrities to stand side by side with Bush-backing actor Jean-Claude Van Damme.

"Americans need to know that there are Hollywood stars who support President George Bush and believe he's doing the right thing by confronting Saddam Hussein," says Jones, 68.

In recent GLOBE exclusives, action star Van Damme blasted anti-war celebs and came out strong in support of the United States' tough policy on Iraq.

Now, Jones joins the battle cry - blasting stars like Mike Farrell, George Clooney, Sean Penn and Susan Sarandon.

"It's astonishing how so many of these Hollywood bigwigs are trying to undermine President Bush," says Jones.

"To see a commercial that Susan produced, that shows body bags, is so outrageous and below the belt and is so unfair to our president."

Sarandon's ad featured the actress staring into the camera and declaring, "Before our kids start coming home from Iraq in body bags...I need to know what Iraq has done to us."

Jones blasts, "Did she show body bags for the 9/11 victims? No! What she's saying is that we should forget about American lives being lost and not confront a tyrant like Saddam. Her thinking makes no sense at all - Susan lives totally in a fantasy world!"

And Sarandon is not the only one, according to the '70s sitcom star. "What does George Clooney think our great army is for?" asks Jones. "Jean-Claude had it right when he blasted Ed Asner, Martin Sheen and all the rest. They live in a dream world."

Jones and her husband, veteran Hollywood agent Marty Ingels, have even purchased a piece of land in Fawskin - a small town three hours northeast of Los Angeles - to dedicate to the

president. Called Bush Park, its centerpiece is a chunk of the demolished World Trade Center - a steel girder Jones bought and had shipped from New York.

"It's our way of telling the president that we're behind him 100 percent," says Jones.

"I think all the people against

war have completely forgotten about that catastrophic day. But President Bush has not and he's going to make sure it never happens again.

"Fortunately for all of us, movie and TV hot shots aren't running Washington, D.C.!"
