Actor Tom Sizemore is battling a rare sexual condition that has left him facing a scandal over home-made porn movies.

Sizemore, 43, who is currently in drug rehab, is bracing himself for the release of the videotapes, which were filmed inside the home he shared with nine beautiful women.

The *Saving Private Ryan* star was recently diagnosed with the medical condition priapism - which means he can never be satisfied sexually. Friends said the condition, which could be a result of his years of drug abuse, could also be what prompted him to make the X-rated movies.

"Priapism is an abnormal, persistent, and painful erection that won't go down in spite of orgasm, and can be caused by alcohol or drug abuse," a Los Angeles-based urologist explained.

Sizemore's manager Jason Tucker told *The National Enquirer*: "He can have sex nine times without stopping. His condition explains his sexual addiction. He's in the midst of a massive depression, but he's making tremendous progress."

Tucker revealed that for the past three years, Sizemore has set up cameras all around his house documenting his escapades with the girls living with him. But someone got hold of three tapes and sold them and they are expected to hit the internet any day now.

addiction has been a long-running saga. He first entered rehab in 1995 to kick his heroin habit. In 2002, he was convicted of beating up his then-girlfriend Brooke Ford. Less than a year later, he was charged with threatening to inflict injury on his ex-lover, Hollywood madam Heidi Fleiss. In 2004, Sizemore was again arrested for possession of methamphetamine and crack.

In an exclusive interview, Sizemore's mother Judy said of his ordeal: "Tommy is a good person who unfortunately got involved in drugs. But he's trying to get back his life."

The actor - who amazingly has nine feature films due out in the next 18 months - is currently undergoing mandatory drug treatment at Aurora Las Encinas Hospital, outside Los Angeles. Friends said he is too exhausted to try to stop the videos being circulated.
