Troyer later sought treatment at Wavelengths rehab center in Malibu, Calif. But by February 2003, he was missing AA meetings, boozing and buying alcohol, The ENQUIRER reported.

In mid-Novem-

ber, the troubled actor checked into the Jim Gilmore Jr. Community Healing Center in Kalamazoo.

"He detoxed for two days and received therapy for another 10," said a friend of Troyer, who now appears in a popular Geico insurance commercial. "Verne

checked into the Gilmore Center because it's near his parent's home in Centerville, Mich. With his folk's support, he celebrated a month of sobriety on Dec. 16."

His manager Elena concluded: "He'll be back in Los Angeles to resume work by mid-January. He's determined to stay sober."
